Education

I was born in 1948 and I got my degree in Architecture in July 1971 at the University of Naples.

Teaching and Academic carrier

In November 1971 started my research and teaching activities within the University of Naples - Facoltà di Architettura.

1975 winner of a competition for a four-year contract and in 1980 I became Researcher in the Disciplines of *Algebra and Geometry*, teaching *Analytic Geometry*.

1990 change of Academic Discipline started teaching *Projective and Descriptive Geometry*.

June-July 1995 teacher in a course of description and studying of historic cartography for a National project EIKON, “Corso di formazione per Archivisti delle regioni Campania, Basilicata e Puglia”.

1999 winner of a National competition for Associate Professor, moved to the IUAV University in Venice, Department of History of Architecture, teaching *Descriptive Geometry and History of the Representation Methods*.

2003-2005 courses of *Thematic Cartography* at Ca' Foscari University.

2006 winner a National competition for Full time professor remaining to Venice.

December 2011 retirement from teaching.

Professional experiences

In the years **1979-1985** I worked for the Soprintendenze Archeologiche of Naples, Caserta, Campobasso, Matera and Salerno to relief of monuments, using photogrammetric tools and ground measurements.

1979 photogrammetric relief of the marble celestial globe borne by Atlas (the so called *Atlante Farnese*) in the Archaeological Museum of Naples, the sculpture were to be on loan for the Exhibition *Cartes et Figures de la Terre*, Centre George Pompidou 24th May-17th November 1980. An historiographic study has been published on the catalog of the exhibition.

1980 author of a Map of the Archaeological site of Pozzuoli in 14 sheets scale 1:1000 for the Soprintendenza Archeologica of Naples, aiming at the reconstruction of the ancient roman city.

International Collaboration

Author of several head words (**1985-2021**) for *Dizionario Biografico degli Italiani* (Istituto della Enciclopedia Italiana, Roma) and *Allgemeiner Künstlerlexikon* (Saur Verlag, München) still active.

October 1980 started a collaboration with the Science Academy of Wien for some entries for the *Lexikon zur Geschichte der Kartographie*, published in 1986.

1998 invited by Prof. Michael Twyman, University of Reading, to collaborate with a scientific paper to the *Journal of the Printing Historical Society*, devoted to the Bicentenary of the invention of lithography.

2000 entered the Scientific Commission for the “Edizione Nazionale degli scritti di Piero della Francesca”, with the task of studying the drawings in his autograph Codices.

2003 started the collaboration with *History of Cartography Project* (University of Wisconsin) as author and coordinator of the Italian Section in the volume on Renaissance Cartography.

2003 called to join the Editorial Advisory Board of *History of Cartography Project* for volume IV devoted to the Enlightenment.

September 2009 called to join the Editorial Board of *History of Cartography Project* for volume V devoted to XIX century cartography (published in 2022).

Publications

I have been author of more than 160 publications, apart from reviews and entries for Dictionaries. Of these publications seventeen are volumes: ten of them as single author, one of which in Italian and English; four as editor and author of essays within the volume; two as senior author in collaboration with two researchers (one each volume); one volume as a member of the Committee nominated by the Italian ICCU (Istituto Centrale per il Catalogo Unico) for setting rules for digitizing cartographical material.
