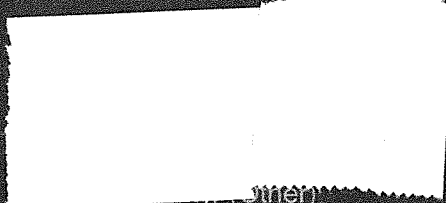

Summary
