I coordinated and developed a new course called "Special Accounting Course" that mainly aimed to foster first and second year students' motivations to learn accounting. In HSU, many accounting students ended up learning accounting in the earlier year of their university life and changed their major into other business related subjects. To encourage more students to retain their interest in accounting, this course applied various innovative teaching and learning approaches such as playing business game, involving in experiential learning environment of running business and attending guest speakers' symposiums and workshops. I designed and developed the original draft of this course and am currently responsible to investigate, coordinate and implement innovative teaching methods in this course with my several colleagues.

I have also arranged inviting several distinguished scholars from overseas for the summer intensive courses at the HSU. I collaborated with these visiting scholars to provide international and interactive teaching and learning experiences among undergraduate students at the HSU. Not only did these programs provided students actual hands-on learning environment with globally prominent professors, but also these helped academics in HSU and other accounting colleagues in Japan to develop research networks.
